### Definition: Loose Impediments

- Unattached Natural Objects:
  - ✓ Stones,
  - ✓ Loose grass,
  - ✓ Leaves,
  - ✓ Branches,
  - ✓ Sticks,
  - ✓ Dead animals, and
  - ✓ Animal waste

## Definition: Loose Impediments

- Worms, insects and similar animals
  - ✓ That can be easily removed.
- The mounds and webs they build

## Definition: Loose Impediments

- Not Considered "Loose" (no relief) if:
  - ✓ Attached,
  - ✓ Growing,
  - ✓ Solidly Embedded in the ground (cannot be picked out easily), or
  - ✓ Sticking to the Ball

## Definition: Loose Impediments

1. Special Cases – **NOT** Loose Impediments:

- · Sand,
- Loose Soil,
- Dew,
- Frost, or
- Water





## Definition: Loose Impediments

- 2. Special Cases (player's choice):
  - Snow and Natural Ice (other than frost), either:
    - ✓ Loose impediments, or
    - ✓ Temporary water (when on the ground)

## Definition: Loose Impediments

#### 3. Special Cases:

Spider Webs
 (loose impediments even though attached to another object)

- May be removed anywhere
  - ✓ On or off the course
  - ✓ In any way

    - ✓ Does NOT apply on the putting green

# Removing Loose Impediments

- May be removed anywhere
  - ✓ On or off the course
  - ✓ In any way
- Two Exceptions
  - ✓ No removing loose impediments where ball must be replaced
  - No deliberately removing loose impediments to affect ball in motion

Ball must be replaced

### Ball Moved When Removing Loose Impediments

- Ball must be replaced
- Penalties
  - ✓ One stroke when ball is in:
    - General area,
    - Bunker, or
    - Penalty area

### Ball Moved When Removing Loose Impediments

- Ball must be replaced
- Penalties
  - ✓ One stroke
  - ✓ Exceptions, no penalty
    - Putting green, (13.1d)
    - Teeing area, (6.2b(6))
    - During search, (7.4)
    - See other exceptions in 9.4b

- Definitions Obstructions, Movable Obstructions
- Removal of Movable Obstruction (15.2a(1))

### **Definition: Obstruction**

- Any artificial object
  - √ Two Exceptions:
    - Integral objects, and
    - Boundary objects

#### **Definition: Movable Obstruction**

- An obstruction that can be moved
  - ✓ With reasonable effort,
  - ✓ Without damaging the obstruction, and
  - ✓ Without damaging the course

**CDGA** 

### **Definition: Movable Obstruction**

#### Examples:

- ✓ Stakes (except boundary objects),
- ✓ Golf carts,
- ✓ Waste containers,
- ✓ Benches,
- ✓ Player equipment,
- ✓ Flagsticks, and
- ✓ Rakes

### **Definition: Movable Obstruction**

- Movable parts of immovable obstructions
  - ✓ Treated as movable obstruction
  - Except when movable part is not meant to be moved

### Movable Obstruction Relief

- May be moved
  - ✓ Without penalty, and
  - ✓ Anywhere on or off course



**CDGA** 

### Movable Obstruction Relief

- May be moved
  - ✓ Without penalty, and
  - Anywhere on or off course
- Two Exceptions:
  - ✓ Tee markers (when ball in teeing area)



### Movable Obstruction Relief


- May be moved
  - ✓ Without penalty, and
  - Anywhere on or off course
- Two Exceptions:
  - ✓ Tee markers (when ball in teeing area)
  - ✓ To deliberately affect a ball in motion

### Movable Obstruction Relief


- If ball moves
  - ✓ No penalty, and
  - ✓ Replace on original spot



**CDGA** 

#### Movable Obstruction Relief


- If ball moves
  - ✓ No penalty, and
  - √ Replace on original spot
- Original spot not known
  - ✓ Estimate spot, and
  - ✓ Replace on that spot

#### Relief for Ball In or On Movable Obstructions


- Ball in or on obstruction (except for putting green)
  - ✓ Lift ball and obstruction
  - ✓ Drop original or another ball



**CDGA** 

#### Relief for Ball In or On Movable Obstructions

- Ball in or on obstruction (except for putting green)
  - ✓ Reference Point: estimated point under where ball was
  - ✓ Relief Area:
    - One club-length
    - Same area of the course as reference point
    - Not nearer the hole



**CDGA** 

#### Relief for Ball In or On Movable Obstructions

- Ball in or on obstruction (on putting green)
  - ✓ Lift ball and obstruction
  - ✓ Place original or another ball
  - Right under spot where ball was



**CDGA** 

#### Relief for Ball Not Found

- With Knowledge or Virtual Certainty
- Relief is allowed
  - ✓ Reference Point: estimated point <u>under</u> where ball last crossed the outer edge (on the course)
  - ✓ Relief Area: use applicable relief area described in Rule



**CDGA** 

#### Relief for Ball Not Found

- Without Knowledge or Virtual Certainty:
  - ✓ Relief not allowed
  - ✓ Stroke-and-distance required if ball not found

# **Ball Helping Play**

- Ball Helping Play
  - Example: ball serving as possible backstop
  - Applies only to balls on putting green
- Your ball: you may mark and lift it
- Another player's ball: you or any other player can require that ball be lifted

# **Ball Helping Play**

- In stroke play, if
  - ✓ Two or more players agree
    to leave helping ball in place,
    and
  - ✓ The stroke is made
- Agreeing players get general penalty
- Player required to lift may play first

# **Ball Helping Play**

- In match play:
  - Opponents may agree to leave helping ball in place

# **Ball Interfering with Play**

- Meaning of "Interference"
  - ✓ Might interfere with stance,
  - ✓ Might interfere with swing,
  - Reasonable chance ball after a stroke could hit ball at rest, or
  - Close enough to distract player making stroke

# Ball Interfering with Play

- Procedure:
  - ✓ Player next to play can require interfering ball to be marked and lifted



**CDGA** 

# **Ball Interfering with Play**

- In stroke play, interfering ball may be played first
- Player of interfering ball cannot lift without being asked (except on putting green)
- Penalty for lifting when not asked (except on putting green)
- Ball may not be cleaned (except on putting green)

# Ball-Marker Helping or Interfering with Play

- If it is your ball-marker:
  - ✓ Move it out of the way



**CDGA** 

# Ball-Marker Helping or Interfering with Play

- If it is your ball-marker:
  - ✓ Move it out of the way [Dec. 20-1/11]
- If it belongs to another player:
  - ✓ Require them to move it

# Meaning of Interference

- When Relief Allowed:
  - ✓ Ball touches,
  - ✓ Ball is in or on,
  - ✓ Intended stance interference,
  - ✓ Intended swing interference,
  - ✓ On line of play (putting green only)
- Distraction alone is **not** interference

### Relief from Abnormal Course Conditions

- Relief allowed anywhere
- Three Exceptions:
  - ✓ Ball in penalty area,
  - ✓ Abnormal course condition is not on course, and
  - ✓ Clearly unreasonable stroke or play choices







## Bunker Relief Procedure (free relief)


#### Reference Point:

✓ Nearest point of complete relief
(in bunker)

(in bunker)

#### · Relief Area:

- ✓ One club-length,
- ✓ In bunker,
- ✓ Not nearer hole than reference point, and
- ✓ Complete relief, if possible

# Bunker Relief Procedure (free relief)


#### Reference Point:

✓ Nearest point of complete relief

(in bunker)

#### · Relief Area:


- ✓ One club-length,
- ✓ In bunker,
- ✓ Not nearer hole than reference point, and
- ✓ Maximum relief, if complete relief NOT possible

# Bunker Relief Procedure (penalty relief)

- Use Back-on-the-Line Relief:
  - ✓ Outside bunker
  - ✓ On any part of the course
  - ✓ Must drop on the line





# Putting Green Relief Procedure

#### Relief Procedure:


- Nearest point of complete relief
- Place original or another ball on that spot
  - Must be on putting green, or
  - In general area

# Putting Green Relief Procedure

- Relief Procedure:
  - ✓ If no complete relief is available:
    - Use maximum available relief as reference point
      - Must be on putting green, or
      - ✓ In general area

### Abnormal Course Condition Ball Not Found

- With Knowledge or Virtual Certainty:
  - ✓ Starting Point: estimated point where ball last crossed the outer edge (on the course)
  - Reference Point: nearest point of complete relief from starting point
  - Relief Area: use applicable relief area described in Rule

### Abnormal Course Condition Ball Not Found

- Without Knowledge or Virtual Certainty:
  - ✓ Relief not allowed
  - ✓ Stroke-and-distance required if ball not found

## No Play Zone - Abnormal Course Condition

- Ball must not be played
- Free relief required

- When Relief is Allowed (16.2a)

# Meaning of Dangerous Animal Condition

 When animal near ball could cause serious physical injury to player if ball played

# Meaning of Dangerous Animal Condition

- Examples:
  - √ Poisonous snake,
  - √ Stinging bee,
  - ✓ Alligator,
  - √ Fire ants, or
  - ✓ A bear



**CDGA** 

## When Relief is Allowed

- Allowed anywhere on the course
- Two Exceptions:
  - ✓ Stroke clearly unreasonable for another reason, or



**CDGA** 

## When Relief is Allowed

- Allowed anywhere on the course
- Two Exceptions:
  - ✓ Interference exists through use of clearly unreasonable:
    - Club,
    - Stance,
    - Swing, or
    - Direction of play

## Free Relief from Dangerous Animal Condition

**Procedure** (except penalty area):

 Nearest point of complete relief (not nearer the hole) where the dangerous animal condition doesn't exist

## Free Relief from Dangerous Animal Condition

**Procedure** (except penalty area):

- Use Abnormal Course Condition relief procedure:
  - ✓ 16.1b for general area,
  - ✓ 16.1c for bunker, or
  - √ 16.1d for putting green

## Free Relief from Dangerous Animal Condition

### Procedure (in penalty area):

- May take relief under Rule 16.1b, but
  - ✓ The nearest point of complete relief, and
  - ✓ The relief area must be in the penalty area

## Free Relief from Dangerous Animal Condition

### Procedure (in penalty area):

- For one penalty stroke:
  - ✓ Use any option in Rule17.1(penalty area relief Rule)

## Overview - Embedded Ball

- Meaning of "Embedded" (16.3a(2))
- Free Relief permitted when ball lies (16.3a(1))
  - ✓ In the entire general area (with two exceptions)
  - ✓ On the Putting Green

## Overview – Embedded Ball

- Meaning of "Embedded" (16.3a(2))
- Free Relief permitted when ball lies (16.3a(1))
  - ✓ In the entire general area (with two exceptions)
  - ✓ On the Putting Green
- Relief Procedures (16.3b)

# Significant Changes – Embedded Ball

- Relief allowed throughout general area
  - Can limit relief to fairway height or less by Local Rule
- Two Relief Procedures
- Guidance to question of doubt about whether ball in its own or another pitch-mark

## **Embedded Ball Free Relief**

- Meaning of Embedded:
  - ✓ Ball in its own pitch-mark,
  - A result of previous stroke, and
  - ✓ Part of the ball below surface of ground





**CDGA** 

## **Embedded Ball Free Relief**

- Ball NOT Embedded, if:
  - ✓ It has been stepped on (or run over by a cart),
  - ✓ Driven into ground without becoming airborne, or
  - ✓ As a result of dropping it

## **Embedded Ball Free Relief**

- When you can't tell if your ball is in its own pitch-mark or another:
  - ✓ You may treat ball as embedded and take relief if...
  - ✓ It is reasonable to conclude from all available information ball is in its own pitch-mark





## Embedded Ball Free Relief in General Area

### Reference Point:

✓ Spot in the general area right behind where ball embedded in the general area


## Embedded Ball Free Relief in General Area

### Reference Point:

✓ Spot right behind where ball embedded in the genera area

#### Relief Area:

- ✓ One club-length,
- ✓ Not nearer hole than reference point, and
- ✓ In general area

## Embedded Ball Free Relief in General Area

- Two Exceptions No relief
  - ✓ Ball embedded in sand
    - In part of general area,
    - Not cut to fairway height or less

## Embedded Ball Free Relief in General Area

- Two Exceptions No relief
  - ✓ Ball embedded in sand
    - In part of general area,
    - Not cut to fairway height or less
  - ✓ Interference from something else makes stroke clearly unreasonable

# Embedded Ball Free Relief on Putting Green

- Mark and lift your ball,
- Repair the ball-mark, and
- Replace on repaired original spot

# Overview – Lifting to See If Relief Rule Applies

- Can be done anywhere
- Must follow procedure

## Lifting to See If Free Relief Rule Applies to You

- If you reasonably believe a free relief rule may apply to you
- But cannot decide without lifting your You may lift your ball to see if relief is allowed
- No announcement ball
- is required



**CDGA** 

## Lifting to See If Free Relief Rule Applies to You

### · Procedure:

- ✓ Ball must be marked before lifting, and
- ✓ Lifted ball mustNOT be cleaned (except on putting green)

## Lifting to See If Free Relief Rule Applies to You

- Not Entitled to Relief:
  - ✓ Replace your original ball



**CDGA** 

## Lifting to See If Free Relief Rule Applies to You

- One-stroke penalty applies if:
  - ✓ Lift without a reasonable belief you are entitled to relief,
  - ✓ Fail to mark before lifting, or
  - Clean your ball (except on the putting green)

## Lifting to See If Free Relief Rule Applies to You

 No penalty if you are entitled to free relief and take relief
